### **From The Principal**

As the winter deepens and the darkness creeps further into "day" time, I am finding it increasingly difficult to pull myself out from under the covers. Nice flannel sheets...a big duvet...it's all too cozy. In our house, the dogs like to sneak up on the bed in the wee hours when we have no resolve to fight them off, a habit which only compounds my problem. It's like having furry, radiant heat logs snuggled in beside you. To add to my dilemma, my alarm clock has been acting up, causing me to sleep a little fitfully, worrying that I'll miss its wakeup call. When the alarm finally rings, I just want to pull the blankets up a bit further, just for a few extra minutes.

As tempting as it is to hit the snooze button or simply lie in bed listening to music, I know that the longer I procrastinate, the more harried my morning will become. I find it very stressful to be late, so there is some motivation to heed the alarm. As well, if I lie there for too long, I become almost immune to the sound of the radio. Suddenly I am dreaming about the news piece or song being broadcast. Besides, as I remind myself often, I enjoy what I do and I love the people I work with: the students, the parents and the staff. There are many blessings that await as the day unfolds, starting with a warm cup of coffee.

It's interesting to me that all this alarm angst is happening just as preparations for Advent are beginning. Many of the readings from the early part of this season speak of wakefulness. In the gospel of Mark, Jesus tells his disciples, "Stay awake, watch; for you do not know the hour when the time will come." This is echoed in the letters of Paul: "Brother and Sisters, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake up from sleep. Salvation is near..."

God's call to us can be like an alarm clock, telling us it is time to get up and follow him. It is tempting at times to hit the snooze button, as it may feel like we are not ready to commit to what is being asked of us. We may not be ready to give up our warm beds, our cozy life, and move into the light of day. Then, I think we run the risk of sleeping through, not hearing the call at all and missing our opportunity to live the life that we are meant for. It may not always be as comfortable, but we can't live our life under the covers.

As we enter into this Advent, I want to use this time to listen for the alarm that God sends to me. Hopefully, I can throw off the covers and seize the day, both literally and figuratively. As well, I hope that this season provides you with an opportunity to reflect on the blessings that you and your family have, and the ways in which you may be called to wakefulness.

### **School Plan 2015-2016**

One of the tasks of the school administration is to develop a plan in consultation with the various members of the community, including staff, students and parents. Many of the initiatives pursued by schools require a long term approach for implementation. As a result, most school plans encompass more than one school year. This practice has been the case in our school. Over the course of the second half of last year, the staff began a process of identifying new priorities for our upcoming three year plan cycle. After priorities were identified, strategies were developed in alignment with our goals. The plan was formalized and put into effect. The staff has found that choosing one of the goals as our primary focus for each of the three years of the school plan allows us to move more deeply into the goal. This year our focus is Art Education.

Goal 1- Art Education: To enhance the visual arts program.

Teachers will use professional development time to become more familiar with the visual arts curriculum and to explore the use of a wider variety of media for visual arts.

Displays of artwork will identify elements, media and/or tools for the school audience.

Teachers will seek ways to integrate the visual arts into different subject areas.

Artists will be invited into the school, both to work with students and provide ongoing professional development for the teachers.

• Cross-grade and school wide projects will be implemented to facilitate cooperative learning.

**Goal 2-Science:** To increase students' scientific literacy by fostering their understanding of and engagement in scientific inquiry, technological problem solving and decision making.

Staff will continue to use professional development time to discuss ways to authentically engage students in curricular topics. We will review the foundations for scientific literacy and the inquiry process. Teachers will use this professional development as a springboard for enhancing their science program.

Teachers will share and discuss science activities that take place at their grade level.

A continuum of scientific skills will be developed across grade levels.

An inventory of science materials will be conducted, with new materials ordered to augment existing supplies.

**Goal 3**- Numerical Comprehension: To develop students' ability to think creatively and persist when solving mathematical problems.

Teachers will spend time in direct teaching of problem solving including modeling the thought process needed to solve problems.



### Financial Report for the year ended June 30, 2015

Another fiscal year has come and gone. One last task to complete before we can say our final goodbyes to last year is to give a brief summary of our financial status as of June 30, 2015. Enrollment for the 2014/2015 school year was 220 students compared to the prior year of 226. Despite our enrollment decreasing slightly our academic revenue from tuition and government grants remained relatively consistent. Other revenue decreased slightly mainly due to timing of funds coming in. Expenses remained consistent year over year with the exception of annual salary increases for staff and additional professional fees incurred.

The end result for the year is a deficit of \$25,306. It has been several years since the School has had a deficit; however there is no cause for concern. The School is very proactive in its financial planning and anticipates that every once and a while we will have occasions where we end up in a deficit position for the year. The surpluses that we have had in previous years more than offset this minor deficit.
