From The Principal

The Ride of Your Life

This spring has been peppered with trips to different amusement parks: Tinkertown with the cousins' kids, the Red River Exhibition, Grand Prix with the Grade Eight class and even a run through the Hi Neighbour Festival early one Sunday AM. Unusual, to say the least. I haven't ventured through the gates of Tinkertown, Hi Neighbour or Grand Prix since my own children were small enough to enjoy them. My trips to the Ex in recent years can easily be counted on one hand. There is something magical about amusement parks, though, and all these encounters reminded me of those days and the journey of parenting.

I know I am really dating myself, but the movie Parenthood with Steve Martin has always had a special place in my heart. It came out in 1989, and because I was living up north beyond the reach of VHS rentals (LOL), I saw it a few years later just around the time I began my own parenting journey. The families in the movie grapple with parenting at different ages, much as we all do. At one point, when the main couple is really challenged by their situation, their grandma talks about going on a roller coaster when she was young. She reflects on the experience, saying "You know, it was just so interesting to me that a ride could make me so frightened, so scared, so sick, so excited, and so thrilled all together! Some didn't like it. They went on the merry go round. That just goes around. Nothing. I like the roller coaster. You get more out of it." Steve Martin's character finds her story irritating. He longs for stability and does not want to deal with the uncertainty that is inherent in human relationships, especially raising children.



No doubt there is some Facebook survey that defines your personality based on your amusement park ride preference. Risk takers like the Drop of Doom, while more conflict oriented types enjoy the Bumper Cars or something along those lines. I am not sure what it would say about me, I am pretty particular about what rides I will go on. I like to think that my weak stomach is more of a physical trait as opposed to a personality flaw. If parenting is like a trip to the amusement park, I feel like I didn't shy away from the hard rides. Mind you, sometimes you don't have much option but to go along with your children and pray for safety.

Truly there is no adventure quite like parenting and frankly it isn't always amusing. Absolutely, there will be ups and downs. You can't always predict which rides are around the corner, and some are much scarier than you anticipated. Sometimes you will need to find some shade and regroup before continuing on. At times it will seem like all you are doing is waiting for the next ride. When all is said and done though, the time goes by very quickly, so make it count. Unlike the Ex, which returns each June, parenting is mostly one season. Enjoy the ride, it is over far too quickly!

St Alphonsus School Annual Community Report 2017-2018

Each school in the province must provide an annual school report for the community. The purpose of the report is to share some school profile information, report on various steps taken to meet school improvement goals and to outline other action plans underway in the school. Please take some time to review this report. Should you have any questions or comments regarding any information therein, or if you would like to have input regarding plans for the coming year, please contact the principal or one of the School Board members. You are also welcome to share your ideas at the school board meeting on Monday, September 10th or at the PALS meeting on Tuesday, September 11th. Your ideas are welcome and play an important role in shaping the school's direction and future.

School Profile

St. Alphonsus School is a K-8 Catholic School. This year, the student population was 232, and the staff consisted of fourteen certified teachers, six educational assistants, an office manager, a financial administrator, a building manager and a custodian. As well as providing the provincial core curriculum, the school offers religious instruction, basic French instruction (grade 1-8) and resource support.

School Plan 2017-2018

One of the tasks of the school administration is to develop a plan in consultation with the various members of the community, including staff, students and parents. Many of the initiatives pursued by schools require a long term approach for implementation. As a result, most school plans encompass more than one school year. This practice has been the case in our school. After priorities were identified, strategies were developed in alignment with our goals. The plan was formalized and put into effect. Our staff has found that choosing one of the goals as our primary focus for each of the three years of the school plan allows us to move more deeply into the goal. This year our focus was the new English language Arts curriculum.

Goal 1- English Language Arts

ELA Curriculum Implementation: To engage teachers and support staff in dialogue regarding the new provincial ELA curriculum.

With the implementation of a new ELA curriculum across the province, our staff wanted to delve more deeply into the curriculum and its implications for instruction across all grade levels. Early in the fall, we held a local in -service to begin this process, where we discussed the structure of the curriculum and compared it to our current practice. In November we hosted a second professional development opportunity for Catholic Schools across the city which focused on rich learning experiences. The implementation of this new curriculum is definitely a process, one which we will continue working at over the coming school year.

Goal 2-Sustainability

Education for Sustainable Development (ESD): To assist students in becoming informed and responsible decision-makers, who actively contribute to the social, environmental and economic wellbeing of all people.

This was the second year of our work on sustainability. As is often the case with our goals, once we start down the road we see how much more there is to do. This year we did a garbage audit, participated in Earth Day celebrations as a school, investigated options for composting and secured an Education for Sustainable Development grant to assist us in setting up classroom composting. We will continue to work on fine tuning and implementing our ESD plan in the years to come.

Annual Community Report cont'd

Goal 3- Inclusion Inclusion of All Learners: To ensure that students of all ability levels have learning experiences that are engaging, providing appropriate challenge to each individual.

Our school staff strives to meet the needs of all learners in our care. This year we refocused on this goal, looking at how we differentiate instruction across all subject areas. We used time at our priorities meetings to discuss our progress in this area.

Moving Forward

Over the course of the year, the teachers reflected on our reporting process and determined that we wanted to revamp our school report card to better reflect our practice and important trends in provincial education. A staff sub-committee developed a draft report, which we are fine tuning with the intent to share with the parent community early in the fall.

In Summary

It has been a busy year at the school, with much growth and change. We are working towards our priorities while remaining responsive to the emerging needs of the students and the community. Thank you to all members of the community-students, staff and parents— for your ongoing support of the school. Together we make St. Alphonsus School a great place to be.

Here are some delicious snacks for you and your family to enjoy this summer!

Greek salad in a Pita pocket

Ingredients: 1 head of romaine lettuce, cut into pieces 1 English cucumber, diced 1 red pepper, diced 1 yellow or orange pepper, diced 1 purple onion, thinly sliced 1 Roma tomato, cubed 2 stalks celery, diced 1 cup crumpled feta cheese 6-8 whole wheat pita pockets, cut in half

For the dressing:

In a small bowl combine: 1/3 cup olive oil 1/4 cup white vinegar 2 tsp. Greek seasoning pinch of salt and pepper



In a large bowl, add all chopped salad ingredients along with feta cheese. Whisk the dressing in the small bowl and pour over the salad. Toss using two spoons. Stuff half a pita pocket with some salad using a spoon. Enjoy!

Frozen Greek Yogurt Covered Blueberries

Kebab Sticks Blueberries Greek yogurt – any flavour parchment paper cookie sheet Large container Large plate

Make a big batch of these treats and store them in the freezer for a healthy, cool snack!

1. Thread blueberries on to the kebab stick.

2. Place on a plate and lather with yoghurt. Rolling the blueberries into the yogurt works well.

3. Line a cookie sheet with parchment paper. Lay each kebab down, allowing enough space in-between so they don't get stuck.

4. Freeze for at least a couple of hours.

5. Transfer into a freezer safe container, these will keep for a couple of weeks in the freezer. Eat immediately once removed from the freezer.

At 29 members strong the plant club enjoyed one of its highest memberships to date.




