St. Alphonsus School was used for more than teaching. The wide hall featured piano recitals and practice areas for the annual St Patrick's concert held at the Roxy Theatre. -One year there was not enough room for the girls Square Dancers so I invited them to practice in my basement. When it came to holding a Tea or a Parish Dinner, the desks were cleared out and the ladies of the parish served up a tasty meal that included homemade buns and apple pies, which they made at Anne Ruhr's house.

One year the Catholic Women's League and the Knights of Columbus volunteered to paint the school. I brought my three daughters to the room designated for painting the frames of the storm windows. They played school while I painted the windows that Fr. MacGillvary kept bringing. The oldest, Barbara, acted as teacher. She said "The first subject is Health. Did you know that babies come out of their mother's tummy?" Up shot her sister's hand. "How did the silly things get in there?" OH MY, Father has just brought me another window and I thought that he was going to drop it. I did not dare look up and was saved when the youngest daughter became restless and suggest they have recess. WHEW!


